

# Phonetic Alphabet

Pilots use a special phonetic alphabet to eliminate confusion between letters that sound the same when talking on the radio. By using these words instead of letters, it's easier to be sure if someone said "B" (bravo) or "D" (delta). Practice memorizing the pilot alphabet so you can be radio ready.

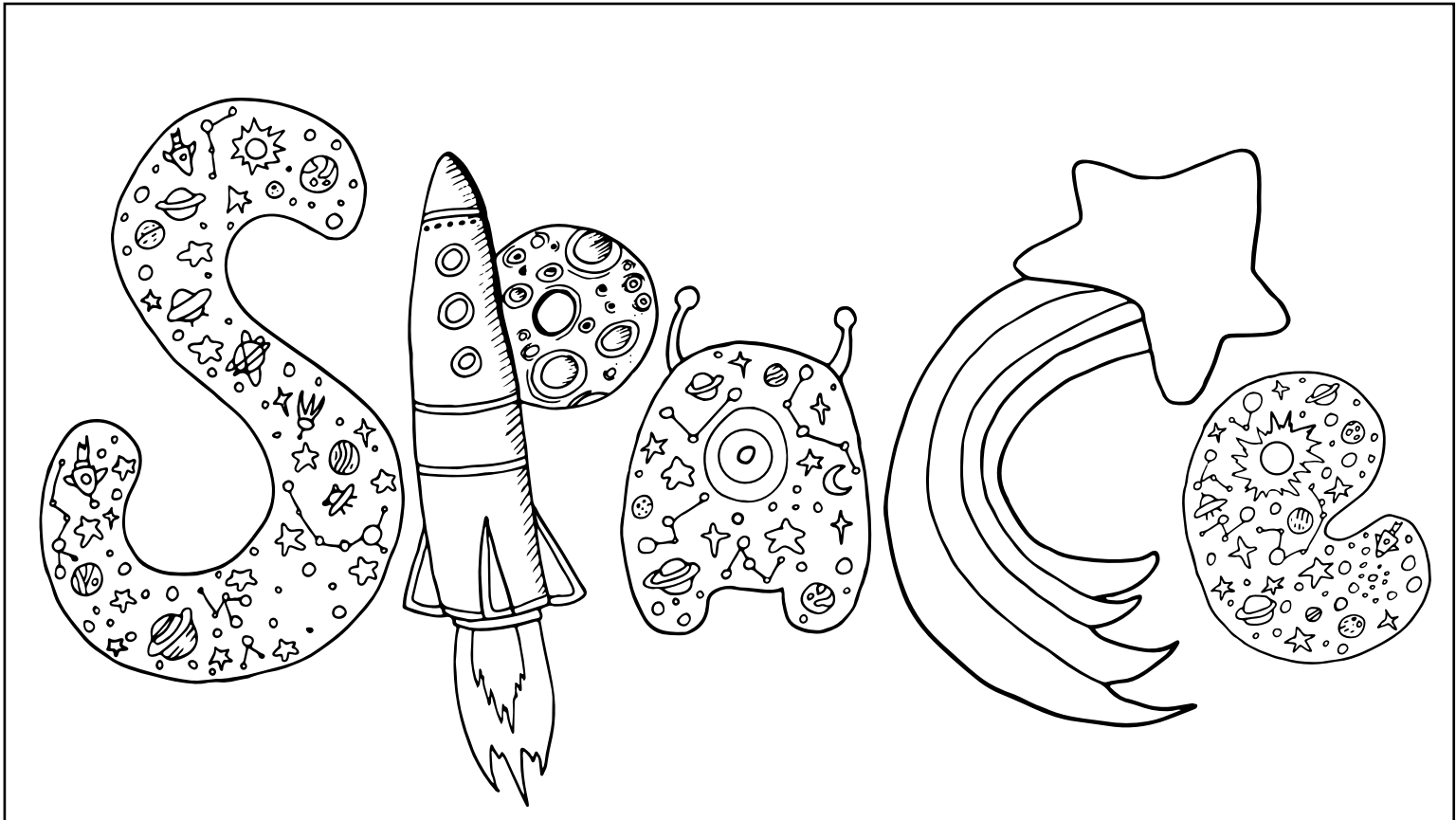
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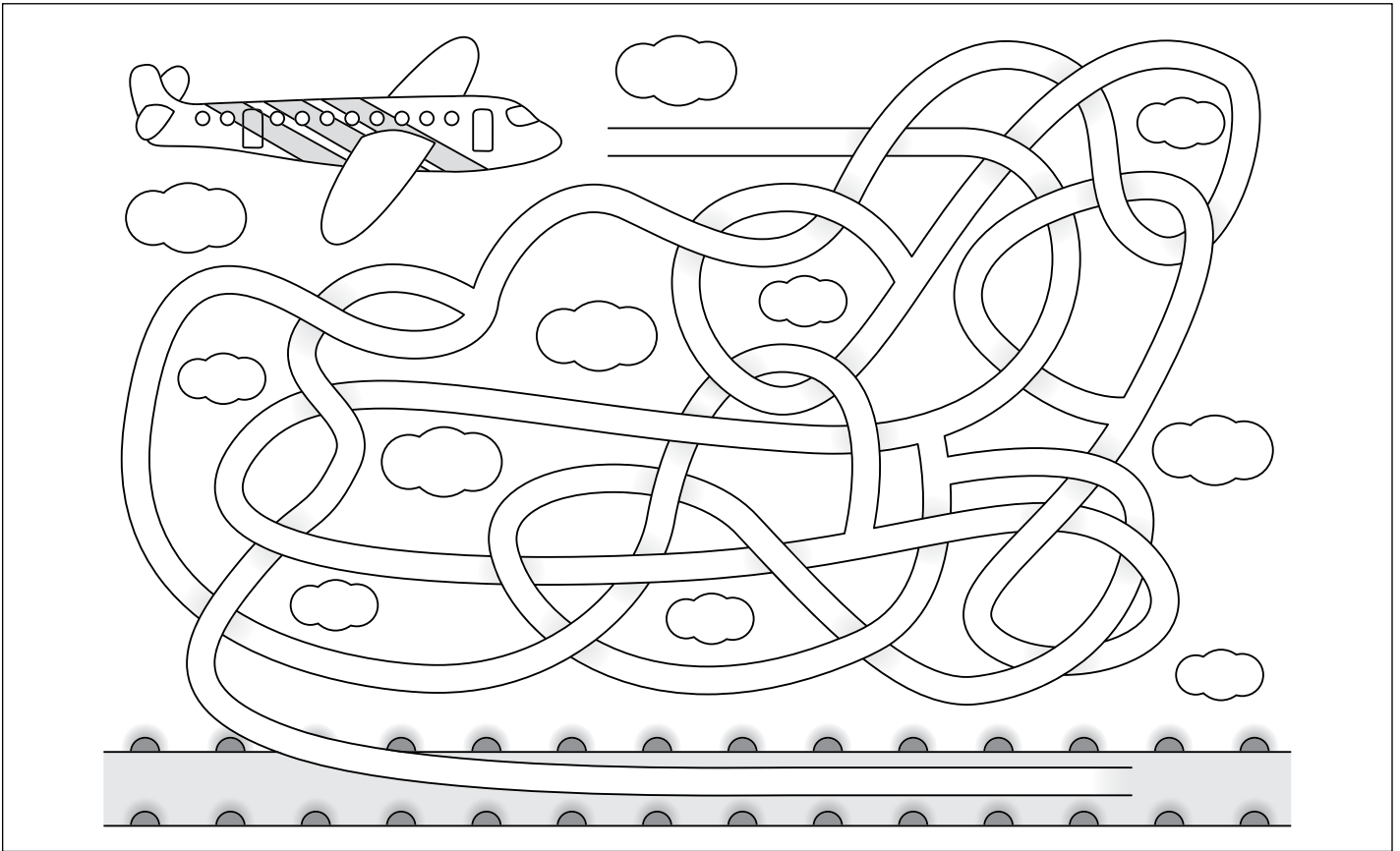
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Help the airplane land on the runway.
